A follower of Jesus once wrote: ‘Think of what kind of people you are whom God has called: not many wise by human standards, not many powerful or of noble birth. Yet to shame the wise, God has chosen what the world counts foolish; and to shame the strong, God has chosen what the world counts weak.’

It is not for our virtue that we are here. It is not for who we are that we are called to this table. It is only for one reason—God wants us here.

So we come, leaving behind the baggage of our self-importance or the burden of our self-loathing. How we feel, who we are, what we have done, at this moment does not matter.

There is a greater cause, there is a stronger voice. It belongs to Jesus who, in bread and wine, says, “I am here... for you.”

Tonight we will journey to the cross... Tonight we remember—even in the darkest moments, God offers the Light of Life.

OUR PETITIONS FOR MERCY NAILED TO THE CROSS

Those who desire to nail their confession on the cross will be provided the necessary tools and assistance if needed. These confessions are between you and God alone. Trust God. Know the prayer of your heart, offered in humility and penitence, is the most honest act of worship one can offer. Lean on our Lord, who, at the time of his crucifixion proclaimed, “Father, forgive them...”

IMPOSITION OF THE ASHES

Those who desire may stop to receive the imposition of ashes. These ashes are symbolic of our mortality and penitence—a reminder that it is only through God’s gracious gift of Jesus Christ that we are given everlasting life.

COMMUNING TOGETHER

Communion is open to all who are baptized from every Christian faith. Communion is served by Intinction. Please come forward by way of the center aisle, take a piece of bread and dip it in the cup of juice, partake of it, and then return by the side aisles to your seat. A server will bring communion to those less able to come forward. The bread is gluten/dairy free.

UNISON PRAYER AFTER COMMUNION

Lead us, O God, by the power of your Spirit to live as the Lord requires: to do justice, to love kindness, and walk humbly with you, our God. Take these prayers of our hearts and heal us, for we seek to be faithful in this journey of life. Use your refiner’s fire to purify our hearts and our lives.
